



**GREGORY T. TADDUNI, M.D.**

**Dr. Tadduni was born in New York City, and grew up on Long Island. He earned his undergraduate degree in 1978 from Columbia University (Columbia College), receiving the King's Crown Award. He earned his M.D. degree from Albert Einstein College of Medicine (in New York City), where he was elected to Alpha Omega Alpha, in 1982. He performed his surgical internship at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania, 1982-1983, and completed his orthopaedic surgery residency, also at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania, in 1987. During 1987 to 1988 he carried out a Fellowship in Hand Surgery, also at Penn. He also received additional fellowship training in spine surgery at Thomas Jefferson University Hospital and Pennsylvania Hospital during 1988.**

**Dr. Tadduni has been in orthopaedic practice since 1989. He is a member of the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons, and is board certified in orthopaedic surgery.
